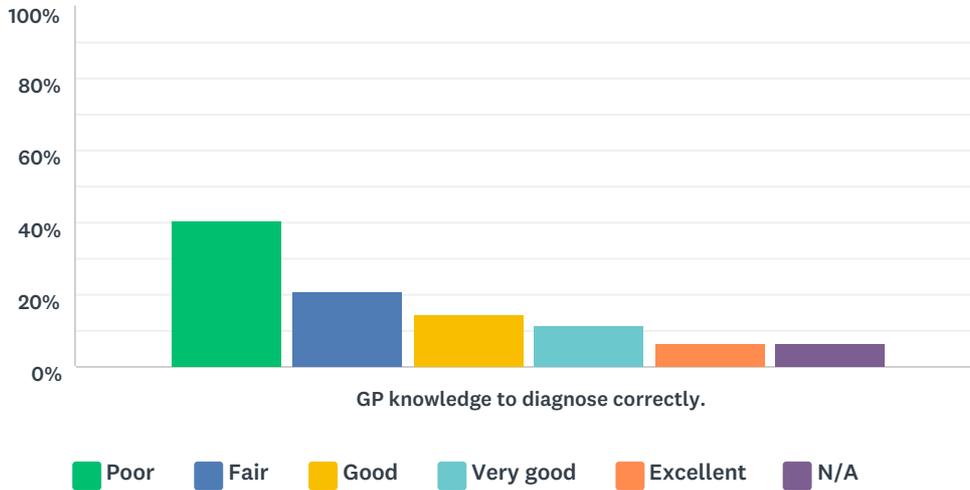


Q1 When you took your loved one to the GP, how would you rate the GP's level of knowledge of eating disorders to be able to diagnose correctly?

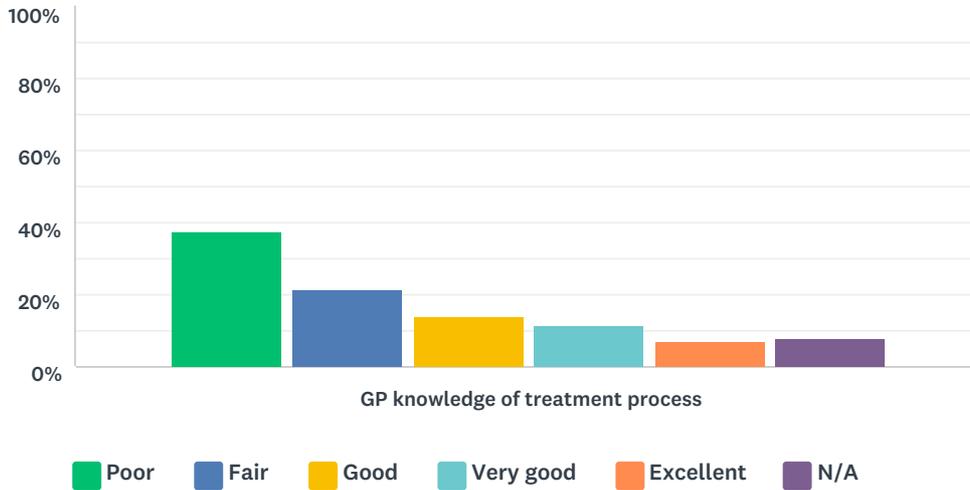

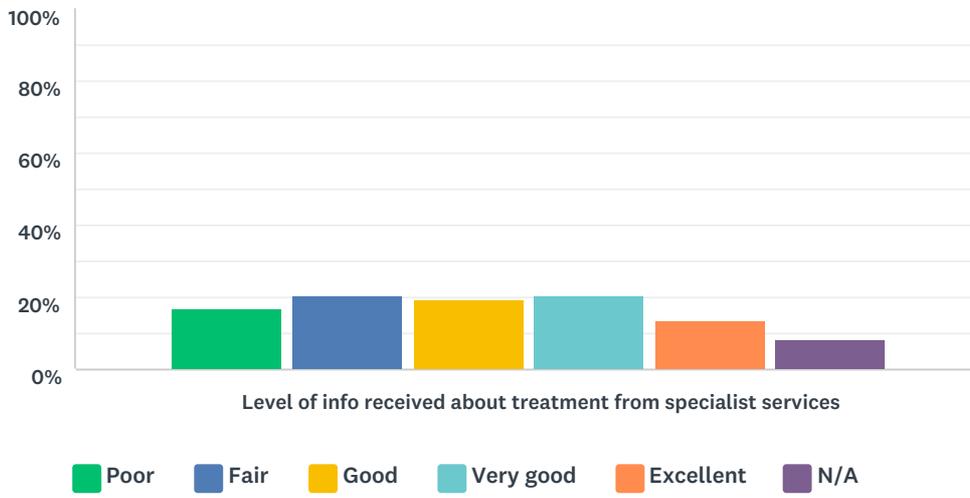

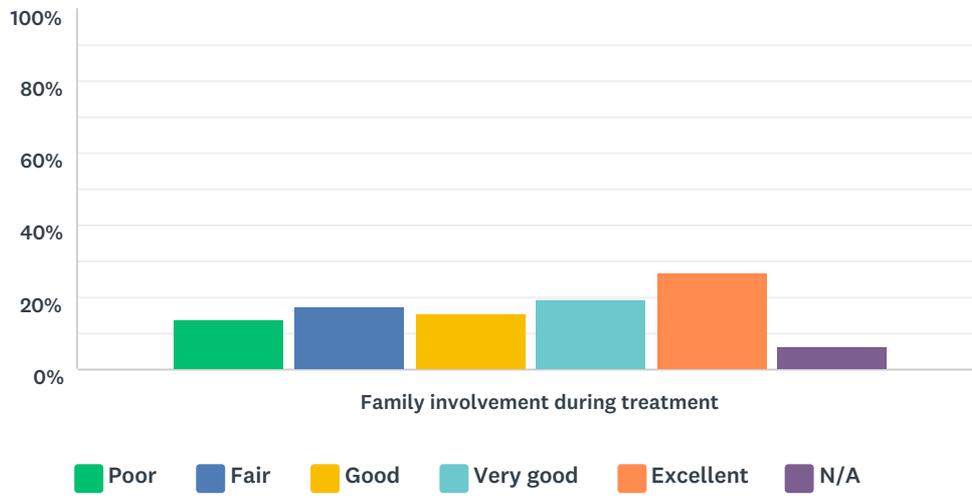

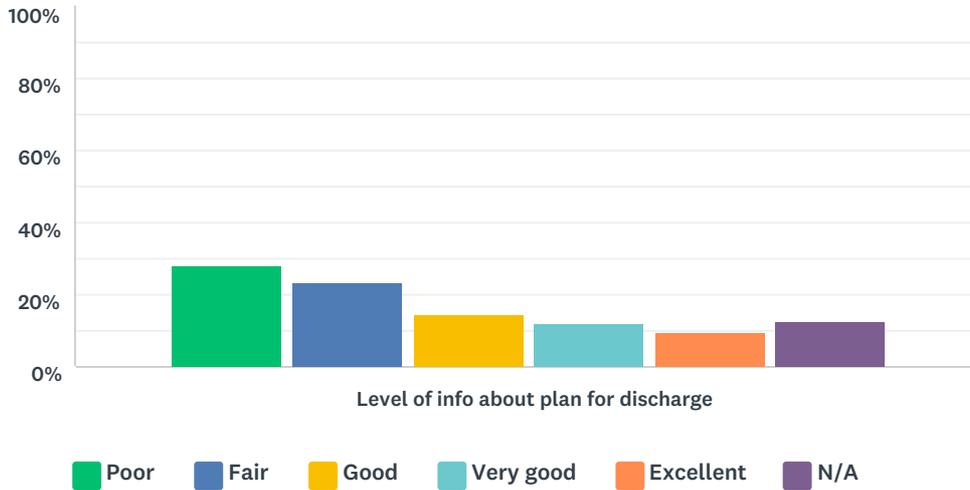

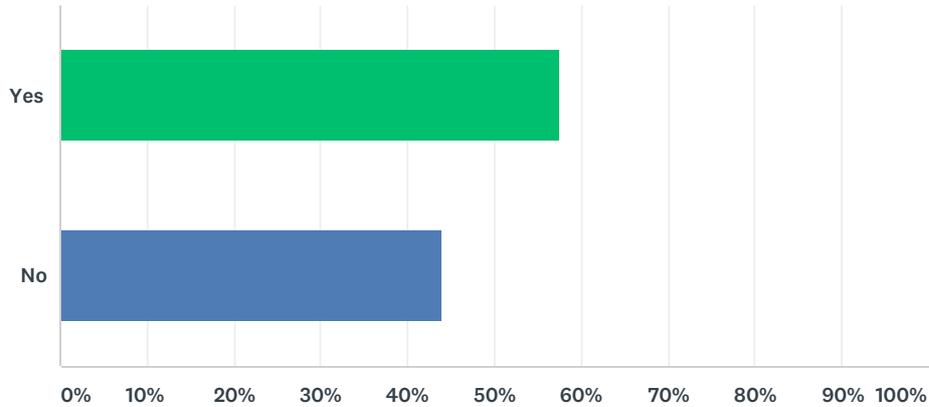

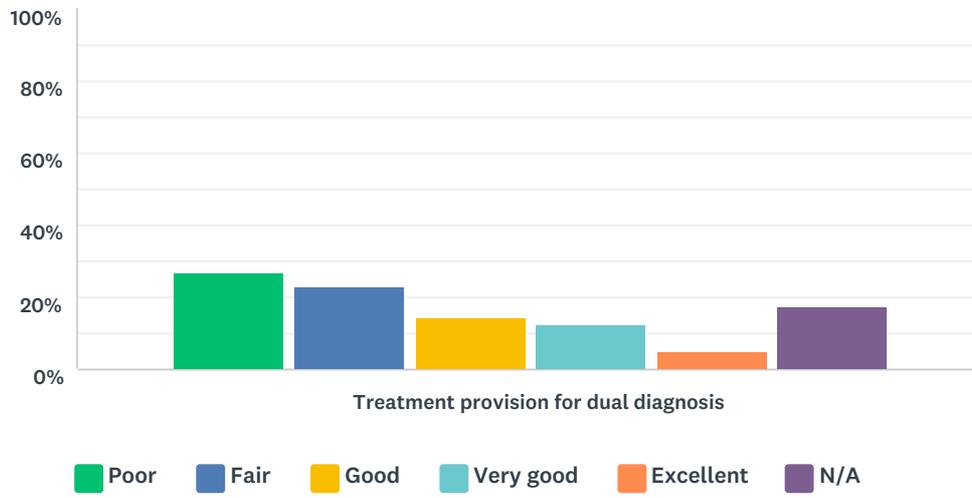

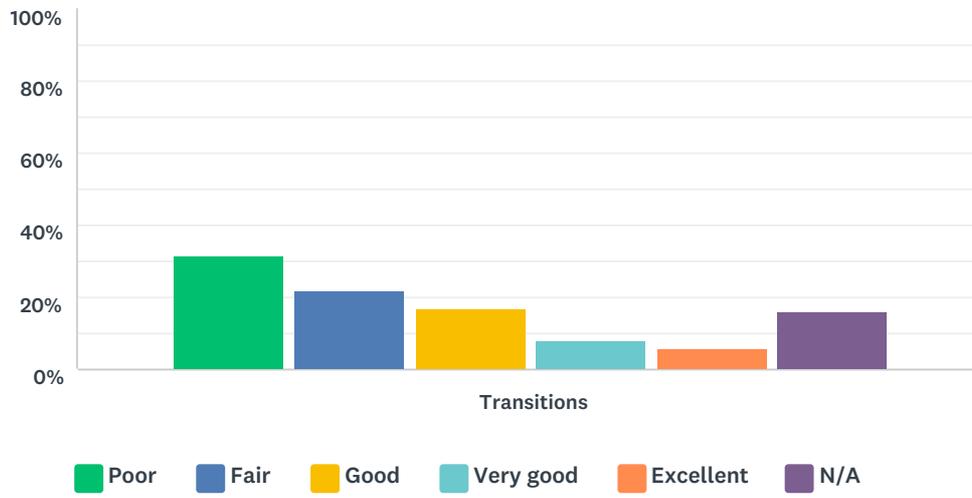

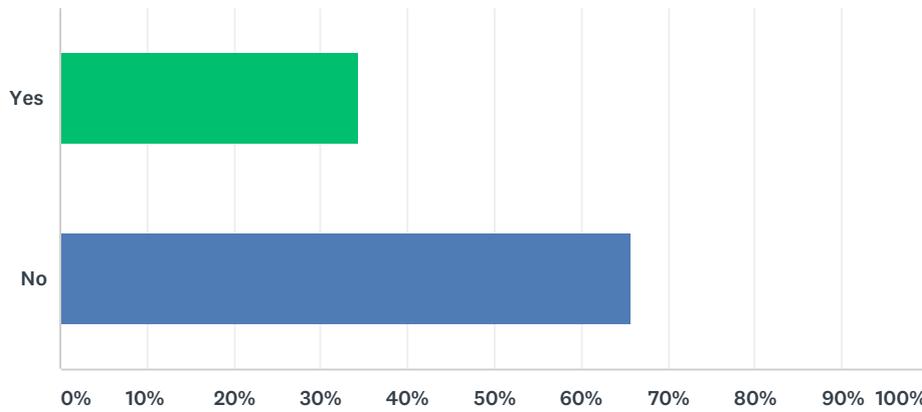

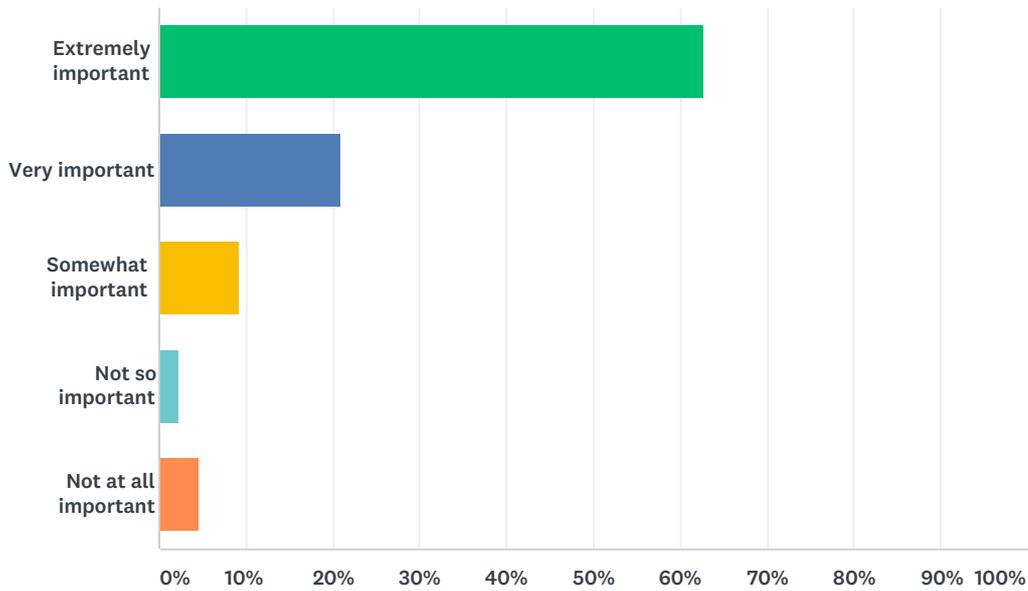

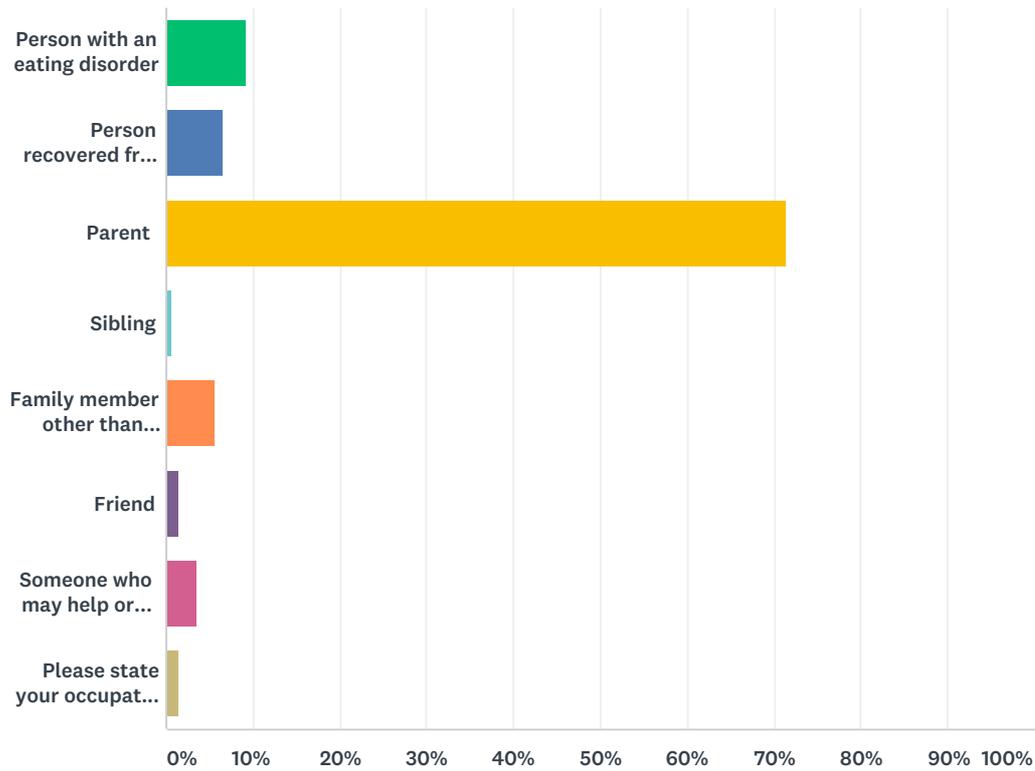

Q13 How would you describe yourself?

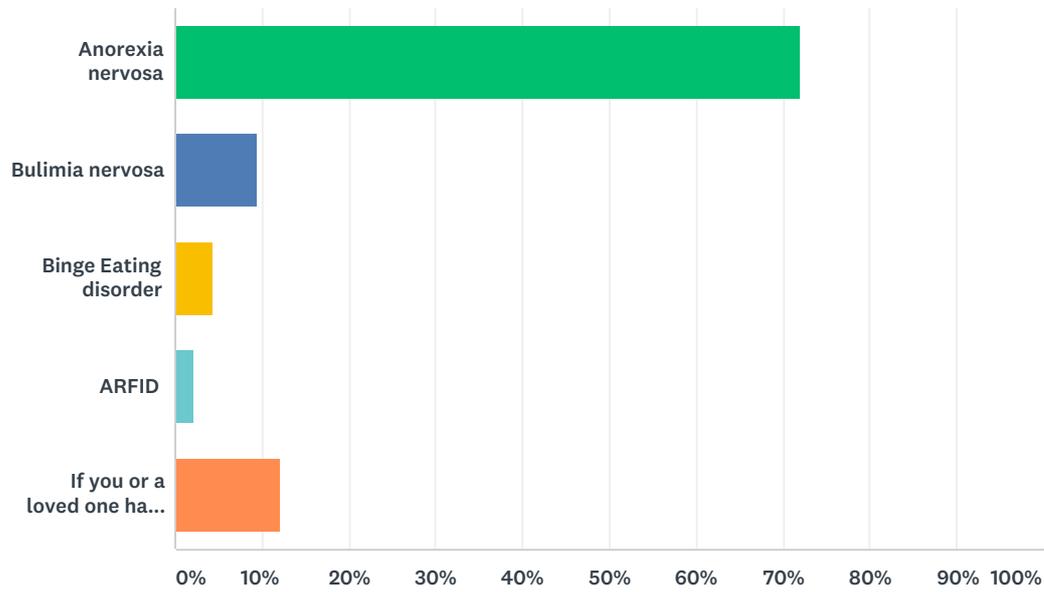

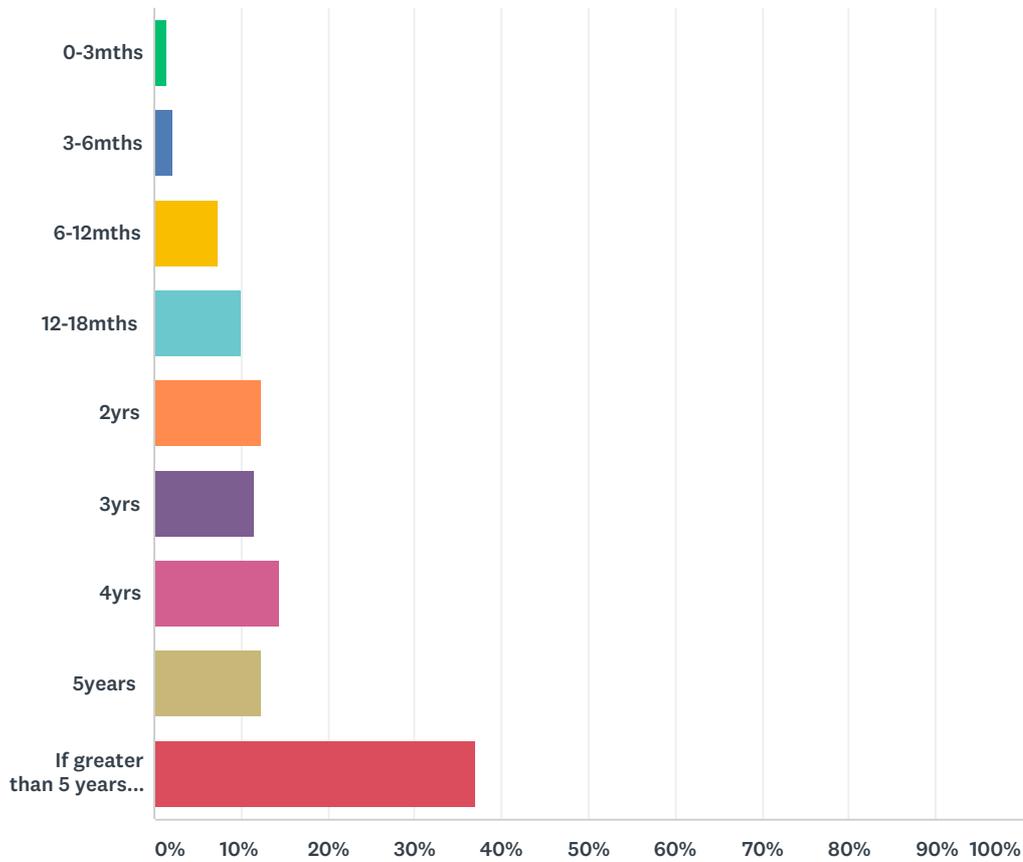

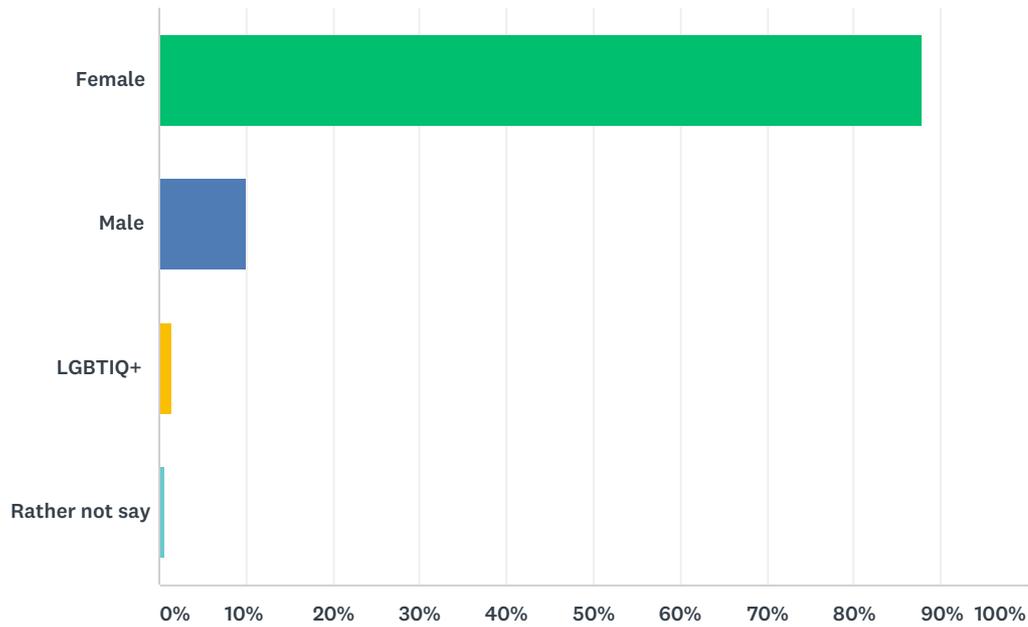

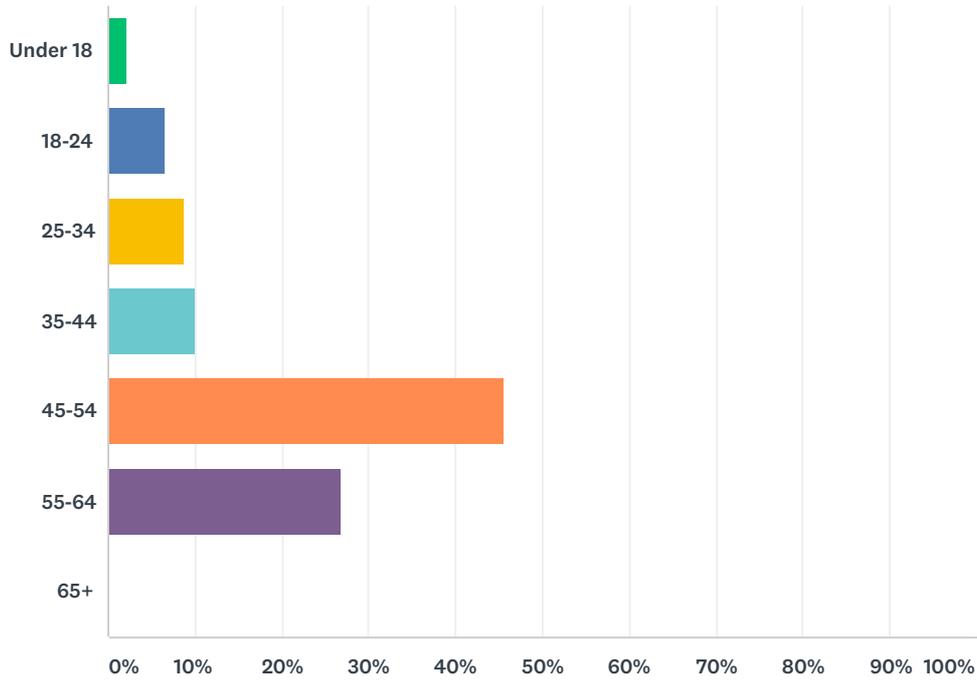
